

Crochet Knots Slouch

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Pattern Description: The Knots Slouch Beanie is a fun Slouch with little “Knots” all over! This is a quick and easy pattern using Lion Brand’s bulky weight yarn, Scarfie. This pattern is easy to customize by measuring for the size you need!

Skill Level: Easy with [Video Tutorial](#)

Materials:

1 skein – Scarfie | Teal & Cream | 312 Yards
US I/5.5mm for Brim
US K/6.5mm for Main Body
Any additional notions

Gauge in Double Crochet Stitches with US/K hook: 7 Stitches | 7 Rounds = 4inches

Dimensions: Pattern is written for an adult but is easily adjustable. Notes are included throughout pattern for adjusting to your desired size!

Circumference 20”-21”

Height 11.5”

Abbreviations:



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ch – Chain
st(s) – Stitch(es)
sl st(s) – Slip Stitch(es)
tbl – Through Back Loop
sc – Single Crochet
dc – Double Crochet
beg – Begin/Beginning
rep – Repeat
sc2tog – Single Crochet 2 stitches together
dc2tog – Double Crochet 2 stitches together

Notes: Beanie is worked from bottom up starting at the brim with the smaller hook size. The brim is worked flat and seamed. The main body is then worked in the round with the larger hook size. The crown is shaped and closed on top.

The beginning ch3 counts as a double crochet stitch.

Pattern Instructions

Brim | [Video](#) | Worked flat with smaller hook

Row 1: ch7, 1sc in 2nd ch from hook & every ch across (6 sts).

Note: Ch any number of sts for the height of the brim.

Row 2-55: ch1, turn. 1sc tbl of every st across (6 sts).

Note: Adjust number of rows for desired circumference. Measure brim while slightly stretched.

Seam short ends of brim with sl sts working tbl of the last row ([Video tutorial](#)). Flip brim right side out with seam inside.

Body | Worked in the round with larger hook

Round 1: ([Video](#)) ch1, work 56 sc sts evenly around, working 1 stitch in every row of brim. You'll need to increase 1 stitch anywhere (working 2 sc sts in one row) Sl st to first sc st.

Note: If adjusting size, work sc sts around evenly in multiples of 4 sts. You should have 1 st per row of brim. For example, if you have 57 rows, you'll need to increase 3 stitches around for a total of 60 sts. $57 \div 3 = 19$. Increase every 19th st.

Round 2: ch1, *1sc in each of the next 4 sts, ch4. Rep from * around. Sl st to first sc.

Round 3: ch1, 1sc in every st around, keeping the ch4 in front of work. Sl st to first sc.

Round 4: ch3 (counts as dc throughout), 1dc in every st around. Sl st in 3rd ch from beg ch3.

Round 5: ch1, *1sc in each of the next 2 sts, ch4, 1sc in each of the next 2 sts. Rep from * around. Sl st to first sc.

Round 6: ch1, 1sc in every st around, keeping the ch4 in front of work. Sl st to first sc.



Round 7: ch3, 1dc in every st around. Sl st in 3rd ch from beg ch3.

Rep Rounds 2-7 twice.

Decrease

Round 1: ch1, *1sc, sc2tog, 1sc, ch4. Rep from * around. Sl st to first sc.

Round 2: ch1, 1sc in every st around. Sl st to first sc.

Round 3: ch3, dc2tog, *1dc, dc2tog. Rep from * around. Sl st to first sc.

Round 4: ch1, *1sc in each of the next 2 sts, ch4. Rep from * around. Sl st to first sc.

Round 5: ch1, 1sc in every st around. Sl st to first sc.

Round 6: ch3, dc2tog, *1dc, dc2tog. Rep from * around. Sl st to first sc.

Round 7: ch1, *1sc, sc2tog. Rep from * around. Sl st to first sc.

Finishing

Cut a long enough tail to weave through the rows on top of the beanie. Insert needle through every remaining stitch. Cinch and tighten. Fasten off and weave in all ends.
