### **MATERIALS**

- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> JEANS<sup>®</sup> (Art. #505) #108 Brand New 1 ball (A) #105 Faded 1 ball (B) #109 Stonewash 1 ball (C)
- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> crochet hook size H-8 (5 mm)
- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> crochet hook size I-9 (5.5 mm)
- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> stitch markers
- LION BRAND® Pom-Pom Maker
- LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> large-eyed blunt needle


### NOTES

- **1.** A waistcoat stitch is worked like a single crochet EXCEPT that the hook is inserted between the "legs" of the next sc instead of under the top 2 loops.
- **2.** The "legs" of a single crochet are the two leaning vertical strands that form a "V" on the front of the st.

#### STITCH EXPLANATIONS

sc-blo (single crochet in back loop only) Insert hook in back loop only of indicated st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook.

WC (Waistcoat Stitch) Insert hook between the "legs" of the next st, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook.



#### NOTES

- of band are slip stitched together to make a ring.
- 2. The Beanie is worked in continuous rnds (spiral) beginning along one long side of ribbed band and with RS always facing.

### BEANIE

### **Ribbed Band**

With smaller hook and A, ch 10, **Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – you will have 9 sc in this row. Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc-blo in each st across. Rep Row 2 until piece measures about 17 in. (43) cm) from beg.

From WS, bring short ends of band together with sts matching. Working through both thicknesses, slip st in each st across to join band into a ring. Do not fasten off.

#### Beanie Change to larger hook.

#### Notes:

The following Set-Up Rnd does two things:

- **1.** Starts working in continuous rnds (spiral) along long edge of ribbing.
- 2. Works across 20 sts to reach the correct position for beginning the Chart.

Set-Up Rnd: Ch 1, working in ends of rows along long edge of ribbing, work 70 sc evenly spaced along edge; do not join, work in continuous rnds (spiral); beg in first sc of this rnd, work WC in each of next 20 sc. Place a marker in the last st made to indicate end of rnd. Move marker up as each rnd is completed.

#### **Charted Pattern**

Rnds 1-21: WC in each st around and change yarn color following Chart until all 21 rnds of Chart have been completed.

Cut B and C. Work remainder of Beanie with A only.

### Next Rnd: WC in each st around. (30.5 cm) from beg.

Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread tail into blunt needle and weave needle through sts of last rnd. Pull to close opening at top of Beanie and knot.

#### GAUGE 15 WC = about 4 in. (10 cm) witharger hook

#### **NOTES**

- **1.** A waistcoat stitch is worked like a single crochet EXCEPT that the hook is inserted between the "legs" of the next sc instead of under the top 2 loops.
- **2.** The "legs" of a single crochet are the two leaning vertical strands that form a "V" on the front of the st.

**1.** A ribbed band is worked first, back and forth in rows. The short ends **3.** Yarn color is changed following a Chart to make a beanie image and 'Shiri Roars'. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Do not cut old color. Carry colors not in use along inside of Beanie or work the sts of the new color over the carried strand(s), whichever you prefer.

Rep last rnd until piece measures about 12 in.

#### FINISHING

Weave in ends.

With yarn colors as desired and following package directions, make a pom-pom. Tie pom-pom to top of Beanie.

#### **MATERIALS**

Finished Circumference About 21 in. (53.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes **Finished Height** About 8 in. (20.5 cm)

## GAUGE

9 dc + 5 rnds = about 5 in.(12.5 cm).

Be sure to check your gauge.

#### STITCH EXPLANATION

cross-dc (crossed double crochet - worked over 2 sts) Skip next st, dc in next st, dc in skipped st.

### HAT

Ch 4.

Rnd 1 (RS): Work 10 dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as dc); join with sl st in top of beg ch – you will have 11 dc in this rnd.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, beg in same st as joining sl st, 2 sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc – 22 sc.

### Rnd 3: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), \*dc in

next st, 2 dc in next st; rep from \* around; join with sl st in first dc – 33 dc. Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in first 3 sts, \*2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts; rep from \* around; join with sl st

in first sc – 38 sc. Rnd 5: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), cross-dc around; join with sl st in first dc - 19 cross-dc.

st in first sc. SC. Fasten off.

#### FINISHING

Following Pom-Pom Maker package directions, make a large pom-pom. Tie pom-pom to top of Hat. Weave in ends.

SIZE Toddler (Child, Adult) Finished Circumference 15 (16, 17) in. (38 (40.5, 43) cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes **Finished Height** 7 1/2 (8 1/2, 8 1/2) in. (19 (21.5, 21.5) cm)



Note: Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

#### STITCH EXPLANATION

sc2tog (sc 2 sts together) (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook - 1 st decreased. sc-blo (single crochet in back loop only) Insert hook in back loop only of indicated st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook. sl st-blo (slip stitch in back loop only) Insert hook in back loop only of indicated st and draw loop through stitch and through loop on hook.

#### HAT

Leaving a long beg tail, ch 17 (19, 19). **Row 1:** SI st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next

ch, sk next ch, \*(sc, ch 1, sc) in next ch, sk next ch; rep from \* to last ch, sc in last ch – you will have 6 (7,7) (sc, ch 1, sc) groups, 1 sl st and 1 sc at the beg and an sc at the end of this row. Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sl st-blo in first st, (sc, ch 1, sc) in each ch-1 sp to last 2 sts, sc-blo in next sc, sl st-blo in last sl st – 6 (7,7) (sc, ch 1, sc) groups, 1 sl st at beg of row, and 1 sc and 1 sl st at end of row.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sl st-blo in first sl st, sc-blo in next sc, (sc, ch 1, sc) in each ch-1 sp to last st, sc-blo in last sl st - 6 (7,7) (sc, ch 1, sc) groups, 1 sl st and 1 sc at beg of row and 1 sc at end of row – 6 (7,7) (sc, ch 1, sc) groups, 1 sl st and 1 sc at the beg and an sc at the end of this row.

Rep Rows 2 and 3 for 13 (14, 15) more times, then rep Row 2 once more.

Do not fasten off. Remove loop from hook and

- **2.** First and last rows of piece are sewn together to form a tube. Top of Hat is shaped by working decreases (sc2tog) evenly spaced around one end of tube.



#### STITCH EXPLANATION

esc (extended single crochet) Insert hook in indicated st or sp and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 1 loop on hook, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook. sc2tog (sc 2 sts together) (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook - 1 st decreased.

#### HAT Brim

Ch 41 (45, 53),

Row 1 (RS): Esc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – you will have 40 (44, 52) esc in this row.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, working in front loops only, esc in each st across.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, working in back loops only, esc in each st across.

**Rows 4-5 (7, 7):** Rep Rows 2 and 3 for 1 (2, 2) more times.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Fold brim in half lengthwise with WS facing out, interlace folded ends together (see photo below). With blunt needle and yarn tail, sew the ends together. Fold RS out.

Rnds 11 ad 13: With C, knit. Rnd 12: With A, \*k6, k2tog; rep from \* around – 56 sts. Rnd 14: With C, \*k5, k2tog; rep from \* around – 48 sts.

Remove Two-Color Cable pattern markers as last rnd is worked. Cut B, continue with A only.

#### Shape Top of Hat

Rnds 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 11, and 13: Knit. Rnd 2: \*K11, k2tog; rep from \* around - 96 sts. Rnd 4: \*K10, k2tog; rep from \* around - 88 sts. Rnd 6: \*K9, k2tog; rep from \* around – 80 sts. Rnd 8: \*K8, k2tog; rep from \* around – 72 sts. Rnd 10: \*K7, k2tog; rep from \* around - 64 sts. Rnd 12: \*K6, k2tog; rep from \* around - 56 sts. Rnd 14: \*K5, k2tog; rep from \* around - 48 sts. #### Finished Circumference About 19 in. (48.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes.

**Finished Height** About 11 in. (28 cm), with ribbed lower band folded up

GAUGE

20 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Stst worked in rnds (k every st on every rnd).

Be sure to check your gauge.

#### PATTERN STITCHES

K2, p2 Rib (multiple of 4 sts) Rnd 1: \*K2, p2; rep from \* to end of rnd. Rep Rnd 1 for for K2, p2 Rib.

#### HAT

With circular needle and A, cast on 96 sts. Place marker for beg of rnd. Join by working the first st on left needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist sts.

Work in K2, p2 Rib until piece measures about 5 in. (12.5 cm) from beg.

#### **Check Pattern**

**Rnds 1-7:** \*With A, k6; with B, k6; rep from \* around. Rnds 8-14: \*With B, k6; with C, k6; rep from \* around. Rnds 15-42: Rep Rnds 1-14 twice. Rnds 43-49: Rep Rnds 1-7. Cut A.

Shape Top of Hat

Note: Change to double pointed needles when number of sts has been sufficiently decreased.

Rnd 1: \*With B, k6; with C, k6; rep from \* around. Rnd 2: \*With B, k4, k2tog; with C, k4, k2tog; rep from \* around - 80 sts. Rnd 3: \*With B, k5; with C, k5; rep from \* around. Rnd 4: \*With B, k3, k2tog; with C, k3, k2tog; rep from \* around – 64 sts

FINISHING

Weave in yarn ends.

Cut C.

- Circular knitting needle size 7 (4.5 mm),
- Rnd 5: \*With B, k4: with C, k4: rep from \* around. Rnd 6: \*With B, k2, k2tog; with C, k2, k2tog; rep from \*
- **Rnd 7:** \*With B, k3; with C, k3; rep from \* around. Rnd 8: \*With B, k1, k2toa; with C, k1, k2toa; rep from \*
- Rnd 9: \*With B, k2; with C, k2; rep from \* around. Rnd 10: \*With B, k2tog; with C, k2tog; rep from \*
- Rnd 11: With B, \*k2tog; rep from \* around 8 sts. Cut yarn leaving a long tail. Thread tail into blunt needle and draw through remaining sts. Pull to close opening at top of Hat. Knot securely.
- Attach pom-pom to top of Hat.
- If desired, lower ribbed edge can be folded to inside and sewn in place.

#### NOTES

- 1. Hat is worked in rnds from lower edge upwards.
- 2. A ribbed lower band is worked, then body of Hat is worked in St st worked in rnds (k every st on every rnd), changing yarn color to create a check pattern.
- 3. When changing yarn color, do not cut old color. Carry color not in use along wrong side (inside) of piece being careful not to pull yarn too tightly.
